Just as in past years, autumn and winter have seen an uptick in activity at Fairview. Our annual Church Council met after worship on November 15 and elected members to our 2021 Church Boards: Amy Mendenhall and Bill Shields to the Board of Elders, and Rod Back, Cynthia Faircloth, and Dick Joyce to the Board of Trustees. We are thankful for this talented group and for their willingness to serve.

The Women's Fellowship had an active month, beginning with the November 14 Fairview Fare, which saw the ladies sell all their chicken pies, baked goods, and country store food. The following week, November 21, the WF organized a food drive to benefit the Bethabara Food Pantry; an entire truckload of canned goods and other non-perishables were received.

At our November 9 Regular Meeting, the Joint Boards discussed the possibility of a virtual Christmas Lovefeast. Our normal schedule of three Lovefeasts, which bring hundreds of visitors to our Sanctuary, is simply not feasible in this year of the corona virus. Because our Christmas calendar will be more limited than normal, worshippers will not see the usual amount of Christmas decoration in the Sanctuary. (The Advent Star <u>WILL</u> be hung in its usual place!)

On November 20, the Joint Boards met in a called meeting via Zoom and voted to adopt the recommendations of the Re-Opening Committee – Jerry, Rod, and Bill. A majority of JB members voted as follows:

- Fairview Moravian Church is closed except for worship in the Sanctuary only on Sunday mornings. For those who choose not to attend, we will continue to stream services over Zoom, Facebook, and Youtube.
- The Sanctuary may also be used for special events involving worship, such as weddings and funerals, etc., subject to approval of the Re-Opening Committee and Board of Elders.
- The Friends Church may continue to use the Blum Chapel for worship on Sunday morning.
- The New Beginnings may use the outdoor picnic area for their meetings.

A limited number of exceptions were also approved. Although the annual Christmas luncheon is cancelled for the year, the Women's Fellowship asked that their circles be allowed to meet in December. These meetings would normally involve just six or eight people, and approval was granted for those. Also, the Women's Fellowship requested use of the kitchen to make chicken pies so our members could buy some pies for the holidays. There will be a reduced number of workers and a reduced number of pies made. That request was also granted.

Also on November 20, there was additional discussion regarding the Call Process. There will be additional discussion with the Provincial Elders conference in December, and your continued prayers for the process are requested.
