From the Pastor

The moment and the meaning could have been so easily missed. During a Christmas special movie set in 19th century London a spoken phrase was "Christ Miss" instead of "Christmas." Hearing "Christ Miss" causes me to wonder how often we miss the meaning of Christ in Christmas? If our culture is more miss than hit regarding Christmas, then, more than ever, the Church must demonstrate God's inclusive love. With Jesus at the center of all we do, just as Jesus is the center of all that God does, we most certain the Jesus within us can be the Jesus the world sees in us.

As the new church year begins, we have many opportunities as a congregation to return our focus upon Christ. Our church sanctuary is decorated for Advent, which can help increase the joy of anticipating Jesus coming into our world. The essential of the encounter like this is to communicate how Jesus offers His love without limit or restriction. It is very freeing to know this truth and live accordingly. Especially in the season of Christmas, may we open our heart to share Jesus's love with others as best as we can, knowing that God is on all paths—most especially for all those in need. God invites us through His spirit, to receive Jesus into our lives and to share a burning love for God: one flame of love igniting a new flame within another! Love like this is symbolized by the candle flame during our Candlelight Service. The warmth and light of Jesus' love for you and the world is God's forever promise.


