# *Resolution*

**Subject: Recruitment and Training of Qualified Ministers for  
The Moravian Church of America Southern Province**

**From: Fairview Moravian Church Congregation**

*Assigned to the Synod Steering Committee*

WHEREAS under the Constitution and Rules and Regulations of the Moravian Church in America Southern Province, the Provincial Elders Conference has the duty to determine the need for pastoral service in the congregations to call pastors to meet this need; and,

WHEREAS the Provincial Elders Conference has the responsibility to take an active role in seeking, evaluating and supporting candidates for ministry; and,

WHEREAS in 2008, the Salem Congregation Churches (Ardmore, Bethesda [now closed], Calvary, Christ, Fairview, Fries Memorial, Home, Immanuel-New Eden, Konnoak Hills, Messiah, Pine Chapel, St. Philips [added 1/2009] and Trinity) Central Trustees provided a grant of \$500,000 to the Moravian Seminary in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania for the training of ministerial candidates for serving as ministers in the Southern Province; and,

WHEREAS in 2019, the Moravian Seminary advised the Salem Congregation Central Trustees that the funds were not being used by the Southern Province due to a lack of candidates and requested using the funds for candidates from other provinces, which was not approved by the Central Trustees; and,

WHEREAS in 2020 a minimum of ten congregations were being served by an interim minister, supply pastors or lay leaders only including Fairview which lost its full time pastor on December 31, 2018 and,

WHEREAS by 2030 a large number of the existing pastors will reach full retirement age and will add further to the shortfall of available ministers to meet the needs of our congregations; and,

WHEREAS congregations without a full time minister members become restless over not having full time ministerial leadership and begin exploring other options to meet their needs including leaving the church; therefore be it

RESOLVED, **That** the 2022 Synod provide direction and suggestions to the Provincial Elders Conference and our ministers and congregations on the recruitment and training of qualified ministers to serve in The Moravian Church of America Southern Province; and,

RESOLVED, **That** a goal of recruitment of ministers equal the number of potential vacancies that may occur by 2030 based on the age of our current ministers and begin recruiting and training these ministers each year through seminary utilizing the funds established by the Salem Congregation Trustees to meet this need.

# *Resolution*

**Subject:           Review of Compensation and Benefits for Ministers in  
The Moravian Church of America Southern Province**

**From:             Fairview Moravian Church Congregation**

*Assigned to the Synod Steering Committee*

WHEREAS under the Constitution and Rules and Regulations of the Moravian Church in America Southern Province, the Provincial Elders Conference has the duty to determine the need for pastoral service in the congregations to call pastors to meet this need; and,

WHEREAS the Provincial Elders Conference provides a salary schedule and benefits to a congregation during the call process for a minister; and,

WHEREAS insurance costs for individual and family coverage have increased dramatically with family coverage costing \$2500 a month or \$30,000 a year; and,

WHEREAS the defined benefit pension plan were abandoned by corporations in the early 1990's and replaced with better alternative cost effective retirement programs; and,

WHEREAS most of our congregations are losing members, have members that have either lost a spouse or have a spouse requiring special care needs impacting their financial giving ability; leaving congregations in a difficult financial ability to cover the costs of a full time minister; and,

WHEREAS by 2030 a large number of the existing pastors will reach full retirement age and will likely be replaced with younger ministers requiring family insurance coverage placing additional financial burden on our congregations; therefore be it

RESOLVED, **That** the 2022 Synod provide direction and suggestions to the Provincial Elders Conference on compensation and benefits for our ministers that are cost effective for our congregations so that qualified ministers can be available to serve in The Moravian Church of America Southern Province.
