The Fairview Band, with brass instruments, flutes, and such,

Played familiar carols that worshippers loved so much.

Soon, dieners in white dresses served "Moravian buns",

Passed in baskets, row by row, and selected one by one.

Next, dieners brought trays of coffee (that is, Fairview's "own brew").

Warm mugs passed down each row, from person-to-person, very carefully, too.

Many beloved carols, printed on an ode, were heartily sung by all.

The Chancel Choir sang glorious anthems that floated towards Hanes Mall.

Young voices sang the traditional "Morning Star" as lighted candles were passed,

Soon, hundreds of candles would be lifted high while singing the carol printed last.

With flaming candles joyfully raised and sanctuary lights turned down,

The mystical glow of candlelight quenched the darkness all around.

Quickly breaking the reflective mood, overhead there arose such a clatter,

That the pastor sprang from his chancel seat to see just what was the matter.

The disturbing noise came from the roof where heavy snow crested,

Where reindeer now paused and their chubby driver rested.

"Ho, ho, ho," the jolly visitor exclaimed

When the minister appeared and welcomed him by name.

Yes, the jolly visitor was Santa, dressed in red from head to foot,
