# FROM YOUR JOINT BOARDS

Your Joint Boards continue to meet, though with the church closed to on-site worship, and other church functions on hold due to Covid-19 restrictions, our meetings have been called when needed, rather than on a regular schedule. Most meetings are online through Zoom with Jerry Hailey hosting. Fairview faces two major issues at this time: operating safely in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic, and our continuing search for a permanent Senior Pastor.

Our Re-Opening Committee, appointed by your Joint Boards to include Jerry Hailey, Bill Wright, and Rod Back, has set a tentative re-opening date of July 19 for on-site worship in our Sanctuary. However, it must be emphasized that the number of Covid-19 cases in Winston-Salem and Forsyth County continues to rise, and our tentative plans may not hold up. It may be necessary to postpone on-site worship several more weeks.

While re-opening plans remain uncertain, the Board of Elders has approved use of the church facilities for memorial services and a wedding. Proper distancing and other restrictions are in place for those occasions. In the meantime, it appears that our online worship services on Sunday morning have been very well received judging by the number of those dialing up or logging on to our services on Zoom, Facebook, and YouTube. Instruction for doing so can be found on the church website at fairviewmoravianchurch.org. The church staff is also ready to assist you in participating in our online worship.

The Pastoral Call Process in the Moravian Church includes three parties: the individual church, the Provincial Elders Conference (PEC), and the person being called by the church. For the process to be successfully concluded, all three parties must agree to the call and its acceptance. We have been quite busy since the first of the year, but have been unable to bring the process to a successful outcome. Yet. With each contact, the PEC repeats its warnings to the Joint Boards that strict confidentiality is needed to protect the integrity of the process. Hence, we are unable to reveal much to the congregation until the day arrives when the new pastor can be announced. At this writing, the process is in the hands of the PEC and we are awaiting further word from them. That may be followed by additional in-person or Zoom meetings with PEC representatives.

Your continuing prayers for Fairview have never been more important. Please remember our congregation, our worship, our boards and officers, and the Provincial Elders Conference in your prayers. Also, remember that one candidate who is out there awaiting the call from Fairview.

Circle #2 will be next for Food and Fellowship. Circle #1 will be next for Hospice. We are checking with Hospice to see when we can help them with a meal.


We hope to have the 90-plus Birthday Party on September 12, 2020. We will not have a Country Ham and Chicken Pie Supper this year.
