### Let's Go with Jesus to the Other Siders

The Gospel for June 20<sup>th</sup> was Mark 4:45-41. A storm hit the boat Jesus and the disciples were in to travel to a new ministry area. In fear, the disciples made their prayer/plead to Jesus, “*Don't you care if we drown?*” Jesus quieted not only the wind and waves of the storm but also addressed their fear of the unknown, which lay ahead of them.

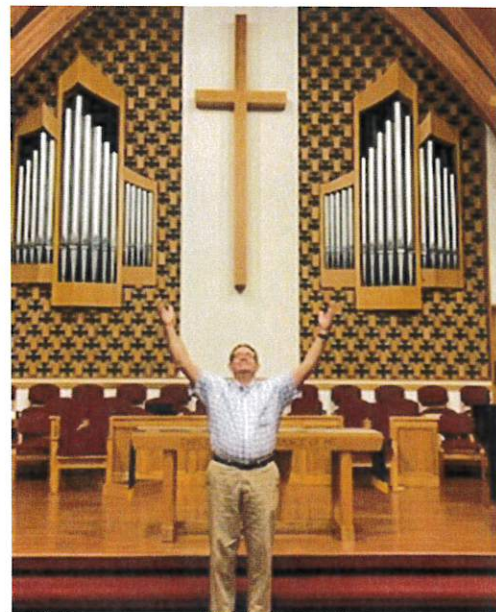
Jesus' invitation to the new ministry was “*Let us go to the other side.*” Jesus not only led them to a new place, more importantly, Jesus invited them to form new relationships so that the Good News of God's Kingdom could be shared. As we consider a more intentional evangelism ministry—evangelism being the sharing of our faith—we can be encouraged that Jesus has sent the Holy Spirit ahead of us to prepare those who will invite Jesus into their hearts. Our sacred task is to share the Jesus we know who has come to live within our hearts. As we prepare to share our faith, we will have an opportunity to understand. Who is Jesus that lives within us? Who are those on the “other side”? What are the other siders' needs which intersect our passions for ministry? These are questions of the heart; which God will answer through practices of spiritual formation such as prayer. We will seek to know God, to know Jesus within us, and to work with the Holy Spirit to bless those on the other side! The Chalice Prayer by Frances Nuttal can help us embody these three movements. First, we lift our arms to God to receive his grace and love. Next, we place our palms over our hearts to draw in God's love and grace. Finally, with our arms outstretched toward others, we share the love and grace of God as Jesus has given us.

#### The Chalice Prayer

Father, to you I raise my whole being, **{lift}**  
a vessel emptied of self;  
accept, O Lord, this my emptiness,  
and so fill me with yourself, **{palms over heart}**  
your life, your light, your love,  
that these your gracious gifts may radiate through me  
and overflow the chalice of my heart **{arms outstretched}**  
into the hearts of all with whom I come in contact,  
revealing unto them the beauty of your joy and wholeness  
and the serenity of your peace which nothing can destroy.  
Amen

May God make us all a blessing as we discern our call to minister to those on the other side.
