Notes From Lewis

The liturgical year is the "calendar" of the church. The church year begins with the first Sunday of Advent and concludes with the Feast of Christ the King. On Wednesday, February 26th, we entered one of the most important seasons of the church year, the season of Lent. While most of us know all about this Liturgical season, I thought I would use this space to refresh our memories of why we do some of the things that we do during this season.

Lent is the forty-day-long liturgical season of fasting and prayer before Easter. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the desert, where he endured temptation by Satan. Different churches calculate the forty days differently. In Western Christianity Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Saturday. The six Sundays in Lent are not counted among the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter", a celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death.

The purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer—through prayer, penitence, almsgiving and self-denial—for the annual commemoration during Holy Week of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, which recalls the events linked to the Passion of Christ and culminates in Easter, the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

On Ash Wednesday, we were invited to begin our journey toward Easter. One of my favorite authors is Ann Weems, a Presbyterian minister who passed away in 2016. In her book <u>Kneeling in Jerusalem</u>, she shares the following poem, entitled "The Walk":

Those of us who walk along this road do so reluctantly. Lent is not our favorite time of year. We'd rather be more active – planning and scurrying around. All this is too contemplative to suit us. Besides we don't know what to do with piousness and prayer. Perhaps we're afraid to have time to think, for thoughts come unbidden. Perhaps we're afraid to face our future knowing our past. Give us the courage, O God, to hear your word and to read our living into it. Give us the trust to know we're forgiven, and give us the faith to take up our lives and walk.

A Note From the Joint Boards...

On Monday evening, February 17, your Joint Boards met with representatives of the Provincial Elders Conference and were presented with candidates to be considered for Fairview's call. This was the first time the PEC offered specific individuals for consideration.

Board members were sternly cautioned to keep this information confidential. There are several reasons why no names can be revealed until a call is formally issued and formally accepted. Fairview members are asked not to press Board members for details. The answer must be no.

The Joint Boards met again on Friday, February 21, to consider those candidates. The process begins by informing the PEC of our wishes. From this point, the PEC carries the call to the candidate. The candidate must then be given time to consider our call and let the PEC know if he or she is interested. If so, a meeting will be arranged between the candidate and the Joint Boards.

Events will not happen quickly. If all goes well, our first choice will accept our call, but this will not happen until events mentioned above take place. Advising the candidate, awaiting his response, and arranging the meeting will take weeks. After the in-person meeting takes place, the candidate will have more time to make his or her final decision. Similarly, the Joint Boards may also reconsider the call after the meeting takes place. We have the option, seldom used, to withdraw our call if the in-person meeting is not successful.

Finally, if our candidate is acceptable to us, and we to the candidate, the call will be accepted and the real work begins. The called candidate's church must be advised and given time to plan for its own interim pastor and call process. And, yes, this will require still more weeks.

If all goes according to plan, Fairview may have a new Senior Pastor installed in the spring, but bear in mind that if our preferred candidate does not accept our call, or if we were to ask the PEC to present us with a new slate of candidates, then the process would start over. More waiting.

Among many other lessons, scripture teaches us that God will not be hurried. We are His people, in His house, and we will have His candidate in His own time <u>IF</u> we continue to have faith and wait on Him. Your continued prayers are requested for the Joint Boards, the PEC, and the candidate awaiting our call.
