The Pastor's Corner

It sure feels good to pause in the rush of life to tidy up work and living spaces. I realized that good feeling a couple years back when I gave the parsonage a good straightening out! There were boxes that had never been unpacked. We had some furniture and keepsakes from Laura's mother's house. To tidy up is a straightforward process of making room in the **space around** to freely live. I began in my study, then the den, bathroom and finally the kitchen counter top. These are the places I use every day and accumulated clutter is easy to see. The tidy up process is straightforward and satisfying, even with a small step, a quick tidy up session.

As Christians, God invites us to tidy up the space within. Our space within needs similar action to the space we live in, but our interior *spiritual* **space** requires a different approach. Consider the difference in exterior and interior space. Exterior space is out in the open where our physical senses provides accurate feedback. Interior space is out of sight and can all too easily be out of mind, but more critically, out of spiritual heart awareness. Jesus resides within the believinger's heart. (Yep, I created a word.) A Christian's spiritual heart is action filled, other oriented, and community connected. In simple terms, one's spiritual heart is active faithing, trusting and believing. Our *spiritual spaces* must be given over to God as we are not able to do God's spiritual work.

When our interior spiritual space needs a tidy up, God is standing by to help. I was sharing with a friend about my tidy up project and he shared a tidy up experience. He woke early one morning and needed to take a restroom break before returning to bed. When he returned, he discovered the bed had been made—the tidy up process was under the control of another who knew what was needed and did it. Our *spiritual spaces* must be given over to God for spiritual care and cleaning.

God invites you to offer your spiritual heart— Jesus' home within—to God's loving and careful care. God sent Jesus to make sure you understand the depth of His love for you. When we open our hearts to God's tidy up process, we are most free to live our faith, to love others, and to live and love others in our community of Fairview Moravian. We together, in worship and in serving God as a community, continue the lifelong intentional process of spiritual formation. Through Christ Jesus, Lent provides a new opportunity for a *daily* process of making room for Jesus in the *space within our hearts*.

It is with much joy that we welcome Pastor Tony Hayworth and Laura to our fellowship at Fairview Moravian Church. Pastor Tony was installed during morning worship Sunday morning, February 14, by Rev. David Guthrie, President of the Provincial Elders Conference.

Knowing many members wanted to meet and hear our new Pastor in person, the Joint Boards voted to open the Sanctuary for live worship that morning. It was so good to see familiar faces beginning to fill our pews again.

Members know that the Boards, together with the Re-Opening Committee, had been reluctant to open the Sanctuary due to very high numbers of COVID-19 infections in the county and state. Our own congregation has been hit hard by the virus. Nonetheless, as more and more residents receive their vaccinations, and the rate of infections appears to be leveling off, and even falling, the Boards voted in a called meeting February 15, to continue to keep the sanctuary open for worship for the time being.

It is probably worth noting that this decision is not a unanimous one among your board members. Some on the boards believe there is a real risk in coming together in person and that some in our church could become infected. The decision to open up worship came after a time of heartfelt discussion.

The Joint Boards conducted this discussion and vote after receiving a unanimous recommendation from the Re-Opening Committee to do so. At the same time, the Committee reiterated the need for safe practice from everyone in worship. The need to remain masked and maintain safe social distancing is essential, and cooperation is earnestly sought from congregation members.

Let's enjoy one another as best we can from a small distance. Our Lord will lift this pandemic in His own way and in His own time; we will once again enjoy hugs and handshakes and singing at the top of our voices. It's what we Moravians do, and we'll do it again! The Joint Board.
