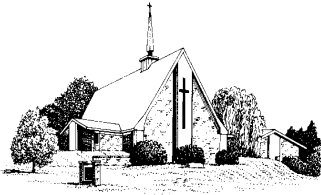
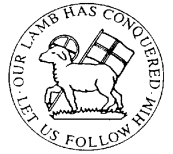

Bike Riding

As the weather has gotten warmer, there are more people riding bicycles on roads and trails throughout our city. It is great exercise and Winston-Salem has accommodated cyclists, joggers and walkers with more greenway areas. This was written up in a recent newspaper article.

As a cyclist, I find a certain freedom and exhilaration in riding with the wind in my face and my legs pedaling (usually) in steady rhythm. Both of my grandchildren have learned to ride a bicycle recently, and Liz and I have loved viewing videos of their riding.

In the book, 2nd Helping of Chicken Soup for the Soul, there is a marvelous story entitled "The Bike Ride". It gives a wonderful account of what our relationship with God can be. Here is the story.

"At first I saw God as my observer, my judge, keeping track of the things I did wrong, so as to know whether I merited heaven or hell when I die. He was out there, sort of like a celebrity. I recognized his picture when I saw it, but I really didn't

know him.

But later on, when I recognized my higher power, it seemed as though life was rather like a bike ride. It was a tandem bike, and I noticed that God was in the back helping me pedal.

I don't know when it was he suggested we change places, but life has not been the same since. When I had control, I knew the way. It was rather boring and predictable. It was the shortest distance between two points. But when God took the lead, he knew delightful long cuts, up mountains, through rocky places and at break-neck speeds. It was all I could do to hang on! Even though it looked like madness, he said, "Pedal!"

I worried and was anxious and asked, "Where are you taking me?" He laughed and didn't answer, and I started to learn to trust. I forgot my boring life and entered into the adventure. When I'd say: "I'm scared, he'd lean back and touch my hand. He took me to people with gifts that I needed, gifts of healing,

acceptance and joy. They gave me their gifts to take on my journey. God's and mine. And we were off again. He said, "Give the gifts away; they're extra baggage, too much weight." So I did, to the people we met, and I found that in giving I received, and still our burden was light.

I did not trust him at first, in control of my life. I thought he'd wreck it. But he knows bike secrets, knows how to make it bend to take sharp corners, jump to clear high rocks, and zip through scary passages to shorten them. And I am learning to be quiet and pedal in the strangest places. I'm beginning to enjoy the view and the cool breeze on my face with my delightful companion.

And when I'm sure I just can't do it anymore, he just smiles and says.... "Pedal!"

Let us continue to "pedal" together with God guiding us in our journey of faith.

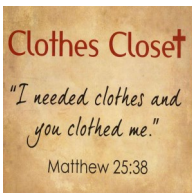

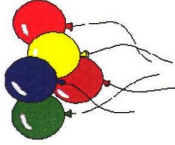

Maggie Styers Missionary Chapter (MSMC)
2018 Update

Fairview's Maggie Styers Missionary Chapter (MSMC) had a very productive 2017, and is off to a great start in the first quarter of 2018. Over \$14,000 was disbursed by MSMC for missions last year, with 65% going overseas, and 35% going to national and local missions.

In the first quarter of this year; MSMC received \$1,732 in pledges from Sunday school classes and the Women's Fellowship, as well as \$6,324 in contributions. Contributions from the February lovefeast offering increased (to \$1,524), and memorials and honorariums were notable (\$3,760). This \$8,056 in total contributions received in the first quarter is 40 percent of our 2018 goal of \$20,000.

We have also disbursed \$7,750 in grants so far this year. We enjoyed a very successful lovefeast in February with the Forsyth Jail and Prison Ministry choir providing inspirational music, and Reverend Robert Wolfe bringing a strong message during worship. MSMC was able to make a \$750 grant to the Prison Ministry in February. We were also able to support Fairview's senior high fellowship (on an April mission trip in eastern NC) with a \$1,000 grant as they worked to refurbish houses damaged by flooding from the 2016 hurricane.

We continue to support overseas and national grants in 2018. The Cuban ministry, continuing to grow on that Communist island, received \$3,500 (for Moravian youth summer camps), Laurel Springs Mission Camp received \$2,000 (for building supplies to be purchased to repair homes this summer). Finally, the Oaks Indian Mission in Oklahoma received a \$500 grant (designated for programs for Native American Indian children).

Please join us in celebrating the rich legacy of missions at Fairview through the efforts of our MSMC. We acknowledge and appreciate your generous support, which makes these many good works possible.

“HIGH FIVE!” WITH JESUS AT THE FAIRVIEW CLOTHES CLOSET

“Let’s go high five with Jesus!” a child was overheard to say excitedly.

“Where at?” someone responded. “Where else? The Fairview Clothes Closet, of course!” was the resounding response.

Once a month, the first floor of Fairview’s Educational Wing comes alive as anxious people in need of clothing go on a shopping spree at our church. Mothers, fathers, and children scramble up to Fairview’s Clothes Closet, which is located in the two rooms at the end of the first level hallway of the Educational Wing.

Standing watch over the room is a large cardboard silhouette of Jesus with his hands out to the side, palms up, seemingly waiting for a high five. I mean when Jesus wants to high five with you, it is hard to resist. Kids and adults alike love it.

The Clothes Closet was the brain child of the Joint Board some years ago. Devoted Fairview Moravians, Kathy King, with assistance from husband Barry and Roma Welch, worked tirelessly to start the program, but when the Kings moved to Calabash back in 2016, there was some momentary panic about whether the program would continue. But as is typical at Fairview, when a need arises, almost always, someone will step up to the challenge.

Taking the Clothes Closet baton, and leading the challenge was Fairview’s own Eugenia Ivy who answered the call and became the new Clothes Closet director. Eugenia enlisted Carolyn Neal, Liz Venable, and Gail Stambaugh to assist. The new team quickly came together and soon the Clothes Closet was up and running and back in business.

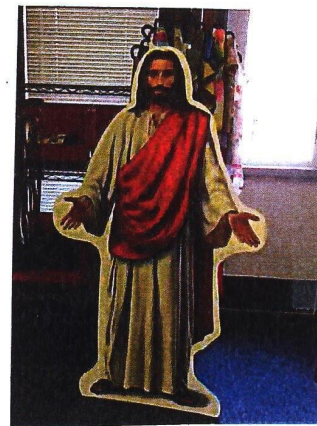
With Patricia Rau, our office administrator, standing ready to accept clothing gifts during regular church hours, the gifts are stored in the hallway outside the clothes closet until the clothes closet staff can get there. On Wednesday mornings, as well as other selected times, the clothes closet staff will come by to inspect, sort and hang the donated clothing. All types of clothing of all sizes, ranging from baby clothes to extra-large sizes plus shoes and coats are accepted. Some of the apparel will end up in the winter room and some in the spring room. No price tags are needed since the clothing will be given away.

Finally, the big day comes! On the first Saturday of every month, from 8 am to 12 noon, the public is invited in to go through the clothing and take up to three large plastic bags of clothing just for asking. Also they are allowed one coat if they find one they like. Often over a hundred bags, sometimes less, sometimes more are distributed to very grateful folks who visit.

The Clothes Closet volunteers would like to expand their inventory by offering children’s books and request anyone who can to donate them also.

Where does Fairview find such great people as these to take of their valuable time to perform this worthwhile service to the needy families of our community?

It was a natural fit for Fairview’s *Eugenia Ivy*, the director. Most of her adult life has been spent devoted to helping others, and she has always been a giver. Eugenia graduated from R.J. Reynolds High School, then from Lenoir Rhyne University, and thereafter, she received her Masters of Social Work from UNC- Chapel Hill. She worked 18 years with the Winston Salem/Forsyth County School system, 8 years with Catholic Charities. Also, she has worked for the Department of Social Services and for the Salvation Army. Eugenia has two children, Brian of Raleigh and David of Durham.



Also assisting is *Carolyn Neal*, who much to my surprise is Eugenia's sister. Carolyn and husband, Ken have been valued members of Fairview since 2008. She is also a member of the Fairview choir, and Ken is the president of the Maggie Styers Missionary Chapter and a devoted trombone player in the Moravian band. Carolyn graduated from Mt. Tabor High School and later from Catawba College. She has served as a pre-school teacher at both Mt. Tabor Methodist and Fairview Moravian Church. They have two daughters: Ellen Ashwell (husband Jamie) of Pinehurst, N.C. and Sarah Deen (husband Michael) of North Augusta, South Carolina. She and Ken also have four adorable grandchildren, Tyler, Jackson, Eli, and Abigail.

Another valuable assistant, *Liz Venable*, is well known to all of us as the minister's wife. Liz is very active in many areas of the church, including the choir, the children's message, Circle 3, the Moravian Unity Women's Desk, and Sunnyside Ministry. Liz and Scott have 3 children, Cliff, Lindsay and John. Cliff and wife Kimberly live in Salt Lake City, Utah and have two children, Raleigh and Liza. 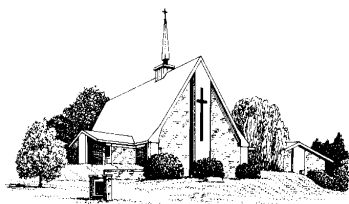
