

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4: 4-7)

We trace our national celebration of Thanksgiving back to the early beginnings of our country. We know the story of how English settlers in Plymouth Colony, Massachusetts (whom we call Pilgrims), battled severe weather, failed crops and other harsh challenges while trying to survive in the new world. A breakthrough occurred in 1621 when the crops were successful. The Pilgrims celebrated with a feast of thanksgiving, inviting their Native American neighbors to join them. Their thanks was directed to God, who had blessed them with a bountiful harvest.

Thanksgiving to God is at the heart of our faith today. Every description of Christian worship in the New Testament shows that thanksgiving is its driving force. The Apostle Paul opens most of his letters to the churches (including the letter to the church at Philippi) with a prayer of thanksgiving to God, and, sprinkles words of gratitude throughout his writings. The more Paul experiences God's grace, the more his thanksgiving increases. This mindset is not effected by adversity. In fact, Paul's thankfulness is often more noticeable in the letters that he writes from prison. (like Philippians)

The Apostle's emphasis on thanksgiving goes hand-in-hand with that of rejoicing. The "rejoicing in the Lord" that Paul proclaims has a depth and meaning that touches the core of our being. This joy comes from the inner conviction that at all times and in all places God lives with us and in us. God is constantly working out the best for us in our lives. Every day we have much for which to be thankful and joyful, as we enjoy the many blessings that God has poured out upon us. Let us renew our hope this Thanksgiving season and every season, by taking time each day to give thanks to our Lord and have our spirits lifted !!



### Notes From Lewis!

The history of Thanksgiving Day as we know it was begun by the early settlers that arrived in America around 1620. Many historians believe that the first Thanksgiving observances in America were entirely religious and did not involve feasting. Later, people gave thanks with feasting and prayer for the blessings they had received during the year. It was an occasion to thank God for their plentiful crops.

In 1621, Massachusetts Governor William Bradford declared a Day of Thanksgiving for the purpose of prayer and celebration. Neighboring Indians were invited to the feast, as without their help the settlers would likely have perished. President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November 1863 as "a day of thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father."

In the United States, Thanksgiving Day is usually a family day celebrated with big dinners and joyous reunions. It is also a time for serious religious refection, worship and prayer. Thanksgiving Day is clearly not a biblically commanded day of celebration and feasting; however, Thanksgiving Day is certainly based on the biblical principle of being thankful to God for all of the wonderful blessings he has showered down on us. As individual Christians, we can follow the traditions of our forefathers and enjoy family and friends on this special day, but in response to God's goodness and his continued blessings let's express our thankfulness every day for what our "beneficent Father" has done for us, especially the giving of his Son for the forgiveness of our sins!
