FROM YOUR JOINT BOARDS

Your Joint Boards met Monday evening, October 12, in the Fellowship Hall. Our pastoral call process was our first order of business and call candidates were reviewed. As this article is written, the process remains in the hands of the Provincial Elders Conference. Your continued prayers for your Church Boards, Officers, and the PEC are most important at this time.

The Boards also took up the issue of how we will celebrate Christmas during this year of the pandemic. It has often been said that we Moravians are Christmas and Easter people, and we prove it year in and year out. But in 2020? Maybe not so much. There has been discussion of Christmas Lovefeasts, perhaps live but with restricted attendance. However, as the COVID-19 infection rates have turned sharply upward, a live service may be too risky to attempt. A virtual Lovefeast via Zoom, YouTube, or Facebook may be possible. The Boards, together with the Music & Worship Committee, will continue to attempt a workable plan.

November will be a busy month at Fairview. Stewardship season is well underway, with November 22 scheduled for Stewardship Commitment Sunday. Guest speakers, including Fairview members and friends, are scheduled for the month. Fairview has perhaps never needed its members more than it does today. Please pray for guidance as you consider the time, talent, and financial resources you may be able to offer in the coming year.

Church Council is scheduled for November 15, and it's not going to look like Church Councils in the past. We are hoping for a good turnout in the Sanctuary that Sunday, but members may also participate via Zoom. We have altered our election rules so that members attending online may also vote. New election rules will be explained before Council. Other discussion centered on offering children's

worship packets and making them available for members and visitors to pick up without risking personal contact with others. We discussed offering a Sunday School class in the Sanctuary after worship for both in-person and online attendance, and having a document shredding fund-raising event in the spring, organized by the Women's Fellowship.

The Joint Boards also wish to salute the Women's

Fellowship and other individual members for successful food drives in recent months. The most recent was conducted Saturday, October 17, with items going to the Bethabara Moravian Church Food Kitchen and Sunnyside Ministries. Your gifts of non-perishable food and cash were gratefully received by these agencies, whose resources can no longer match demands for assistance. Thanks, Ladies!
