In the corporate world, a growing emphasis has been on "continuous improvement." No process, product, or sales strategy is considered permanent.

Everything is open to review for better ways of working towards a common goal. It is a highly participatory process implemented by management and labor working together. In the church, we refer instead to "transformation." We proclaim that we are being transformed by Christ's love. It is the ongoing work of the indwelling Holy Spirit.

For, we are called to "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who is at work in you..." (Philippians 2:12-13)

As individuals we ask "How is God at work in me?" As a congregation, we ask "How is God at work among us?" These are inseparable. A congregation's capacity to faithfully discern God's leading is severely hampered when individuals are "stuck" and not actively deepening their trust ion the Living God. In a growing congregation, each individual is highly committed to continuous "soulwork" for themselves and the congregation alike. In the church, be believe that the Holy Spirit **does** the work. We **offer** our willingness to change. We **offer** our trust in God's continuous improvement of our unique soul.

To this end, Fairview will have several extra opportunities for individual and shared "soul work" in the coming weeks. They are an intricate part of our transitional ministry process. Ruth Cole Burcaw (who led our Day of Discovery on March 31st), will lead a program on **"Discovering Your** Spiritual Type" on Sunday September

(Includes a light supper). The aim is to help us know our own soul better (How do we best experience God?). We will also be growing in our understanding of our congregation (How do Christians of varied types best experience God? How can we structure our faith development as a church so that our different "types" are enriched? How do we apply this understanding of varied spiritual types in our outreach and mission endeavors?).




Join Us For Breakfast!



Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry



Our kickoff for the Shoebox Ministry will be Sunday morning October 6, 2019. For our early shoppers, a list of suggested items to purchase is listed in this newsletter. We are looking forward, with your help to filling 100 Shoeboxes. These shoeboxes are a vital part of the missionary effort to bring the Good News of Jesus' love to children. These children are probably some of the neediest in the world. As always, if you are unable to shop or just do not like to shop, we will accept your monetary donations and shop for you. We hope that you will feel blessed to participation in this outreach ministry and that our efforts will be pleasing to our Lord. We ask for your prayers that we will be successful and prayers for the children who will receive our gifts. We are a church united in our efforts to reach out to those in need. Our kickoff will be **Sunday Oct 6th.** Shoeboxes will be available

that day and will contain a brochure with instructions.

- 1. Decide on boy or girl and age (2-4) (5-9) (10-14)
- 2. Buy appropriate gifts and place in boxes.
- 3. The last item to enclose is \$9.00 cash or check for

delivery. To follow your box refer to info in the brochure.

- 4. Remove the boy or girl label from the brochure.
- 5. Mark the appropriate age and tape on the top of box.
- 6. Place rubber band around the middle of the box to secure.
- 7. Bring filled boxes to church anytime & we will store securely.

Suggested Items For The Boxes...

Start with a <u>Wow</u> item that the child will cherish, like a beautiful doll, stuffed animal, or a deflated soccer ball with pump.

Coloring books, activity pads, crayons, colored pencils, pencils/ erasers, pencil sharpeners, solar calculators, school supplies, soap (in plastic bags), washcloth, toothbrush, jump rope, small dolls, harmonicas small cars/trucks, balls, yo-yo, pack of cards, picture books, slinky, hair brush, comb, toy jewelry, hair bands, hair bows, flash light (extra batteries), tote bags, t-shirts, socks, ball caps.

The Program culminates—Sunday, November 10. Our shoeboxes will be placed in the Sanctuary that morning for a blessing.
