The Pastor's Corner

A while back as I was swimming laps, I started thinking about biblical numbers. (Swimming back and forth can be boring!). Lap #1 - God. Another 1, that is, Jesus the only Son. When 2 or 3 are gathered. The Trinity (3), 7 days of creation. 40 days, 40 years. I was about to stop at 40 laps when I realized, hey, 50 days for Pentecost! How could we be more open to the work of the Holy Spirit-in our own lives and the life of our congregation-if we took the 50 days from Easter to Pentecost as a model for the whole year? Yes, the numbers don't come out exactly, but imagine the possibilities of a Spiritcentered congregation life! Season 1- Advent (preparing for the birth of Jesus). Season 2 – Christmas and the days that follow. Season 3 - Lent (preparing for Easter). Season 4 – Easter (the season we are in now). Season 5 - The days following Pentecost. Season 6 – The Days to end summer. Season 7- the days when church programs get going again. NOTE: 5, 6, and 7 are officially taken together but I wanted to get to 7! Each of us could develop the concept of seasons for our lives of faith, family, career. etc.

Then I started to think how our spirits would be if we considered how the Holy Spirit attends to our needs through these all the seasons and circumstances of life. When we **prepare**, the Holy Spirit is guiding that preparation. When we are **in the midst of it**—whatever "it" is—the Holy Spirit is empowering and guiding, bringing comfort and peace. When things **complete**, the Holy Spirit helps us to use the time of rest as a well-earned Sabbath. As seasons repeat, so would these.

Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit so that the plans and purposes of God would continue after Jesus returned to the Father. Jesus taught us, "Good thing I am leaving because the Holy Spirit is just what you need to live lives full of grace, and the Holy Spirit can only come when I leave." Living Spirit-filled lives as Jesus promised makes all the difference, no matter the season or circumstance of life. Through the Spirit our own spirit will grow and become all that God intends. May we all know the love of God, His Spirit, within us. May others recognize God's love within us in all that we do. <u>Through the Spirit, all things are</u> <u>possible... just as Jesus promised!</u>

Did you know? A History of the Mission Society. The lay mission involvement in short-term mission service dates back to the early 1950s. In 1952 Dr. F.L. Goble, Jr., a surgeon, and Lewis "Tink" Kanoy, a radio station engineer, spent a month in Nicaragua. Dr. Goble assisted Dr. Thaeler with surgery. "Tink" Kanoy built transmitters and receivers and trained missionary personnel in the use of the amateur radio stations. In the years that followed, Kanoy and the Mission Society raised money to provide similar equipment at the mission stations throughout Central America. "Tink" and his wife Ethel remained on the radio with the Central American fields practically every day, as did four or five others in the Southern Province who joined them for many years. Mission interest swelled during 1955 and 1956, leading up to the Year of Missions in 1956. The Wachovia Moravian published special articles on missions, and the churches enlisted new members for the Mission Society. Some churches added over one hundred members in a year. There were seven hundred and thirty new members in 1956, and the total membership stood at 4,057. An anonymous poem appeared on the program for the 1957 annual lovefeast. Its words seemed to express the spirit of that time in the Southern Province: I am but one in this vast multitude of the world. But I am one. I cannot do everything, but I can do something, What I can do, I ought to do. What I ought to do, by the grace of God, I will do. (Taken from "A 75 Year History of the Mission Society of the Moravian Church, South" by Christian D. Weber). Tink Kanoy was a member of Fairview Moravian Church from 1949 until his death in 2010.
